Amrik's journey with the Teamsters began in 2017 when the union successfully organized Simard Westlink, a pivotal moment that ignited his passion for labour advocacy. Since then, he has been a strong member and owner-operator driver, amassing valuable experience in port, rail, highway driving and grievances. Amrik's dedication to the union was evident as he rose through the ranks, serving as an elected Shop Steward, a key player on the Bargaining Committee, and a steadfast Picketline Captain.

In 2023, Amrik made a notable impact when actively contributing to the union committee's efforts to secure a ground-breaking port program. This program offers a lifeline to owner-operators who require a layoff due to lack of work, granting a much-needed 90-day relief on port tags. It's an endeavour that illustrates Amrik's commitment to improving his fellow drivers' working conditions and livelihood.

Drawing from his experience as an owner-operator in the trucking industry, Amrik recognizes the stark difference between being part of a union and navigating the challenges of non-union work. He passionately affirms, "I am proud to be a Teamster, helping port drivers realize the importance of union solidarity. With the Teamsters, we aim to end favouritism, ensure that management listens to the drivers, and negotiate more



advantageous contracts than the current Container Trucking Act agreement. I enjoy my role as a Teamsters Business Agent, where I can assist all drivers, including those in my community who may face language barriers."

He believes that the appointment of Amrik Dhillon as a Business Agent is a stronghold for the union and the entire port driver community.
